### POLITICS 2014

#### DEADLINE MARCH 1: DISTRICT LODGE 66 ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIP

Once again, it is time for the District's Annual Scholarship Program as approved by your Delegates to District Lodge 66. It is open to all High School Seniors that are children of any IAMAW Lodge that is affiliated with District Lodge No. 66. This includes Lodges 21, 1030, 1115, 1771 and 2191.

There are Two (2) \$750 scholarships annually, one for a female student and one for a male student. If we do not have one of each, then it will be given to two female or male students. Only seniors in High School that are the children of Machinist Union members and those that are seeking post high school education are eligible.

An essay must be written and must be based on how Unions have been important to your family and your community to be considered for the Scholarship. Information should be gathered from your parents or relatives and the struggles they may have faced in their jobs. The essays must be at least 500 words in length. Please note: Essays copied directly from Labor History Books, encyclopedias, etc., or essays where the material is mostly plagiarized will NOT BE ACCEPTED. After a review of the competency of each essay, a selection process will follow and the winner will be the essay that best meets the requirements stated above.

The scholarship must be used beginning in the year of the award and in consecutive semesters. The first half of the scholarship will be paid directly to the school in the first semester and the second half will also be paid directly to the school in the next consecutive semester. Selections of essay winners will take place no later than the April

Meeting of the District Lodge. <u>The essays must be in at the District Lodge 66 office</u> <u>1307 Market St., La Crosse WI by Saturday, March 1, 2014</u>. Scholarships not used in consecutive semesters beginning in the year of the award will be forfeited.

The District Lodge Delegates attended the regular monthly meeting on Monday January 20. The delegates took action on a number of issues brought before them. One item of particular interest to our members will be action taken concerning the **Midwest Ride for Guides Motorcycle Poker Run**. As some may recall from my past articles, District Lodge 66 will be co-sponsoring this event along with Districts 10 and W-3. This is the

Sixth Annual Spirit of the Midwest Rides for Guide event that has raised over \$227,000.00 in support of Guide Dogs of America. The following is a bit of the history of our involvement...We Invite You to Join the Partnership!

As wonderful as modern technology is, no invention comes close to the incredible accomplishments of a bright, willing, well-trained guide dog. Since its founding **through donations by the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers Union in 1948**, <u>Guide Dogs of America</u> in Sylmar, California has helped blind men and women recover their ability to move freely and regain independence through partnership with these remarkable animals.

Joseph W. Jones, Sr., was refused a guide dog because of his age – he was fifty seven – but he would not accept defeat. He researched the Guide Dog Movement and with the help of the International Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers, established his own school, one that would provide guide dogs free of charge to visually impaired people regardless of their age. Due to the fact that our services are free of charge to the blind community, we depend solely on voluntary donations, bequests, fund raising events, clubs and organizations to support our program. Your donation or bequest to Guide Dogs of America helps continue this legacy to provide the gift of freedom, mobility and independence through the use of these loving and loyal dogs. To breed, raise and train a fully-qualified guide dog and provide instruction in the use of these special dogs for safe mobility costs approximately \$38,000. Because of the continued support we receive from our donors, GDA has succeeded in providing all its services guide dogs, specially designed harness, individualized in-residence training and lifetime follow-up, at no cost, to more than 2,500 blind recipients.
