District 66 urges Support For Striking Belshaw Adamatic Workers

All of our Local Lodges received a first appeal on behalf of the workers of Belshaw. Although no regular Lodge meetings are scheduled in July, I would urge each of the Local Lodge officers to watch your mail for a second appeal. If that should be received please consider taking action on the request by polling your executive board. There is no point to waiting until August if assistance is requested.

It's been over three months on the picket line for members of IAM Local Lodge 79 on strike against Belshaw Adamatic, an international bakery equipment maker based in Auburn, WA.

The 60 members traded their tools for picket signs when the company refused to pass health care costs savings – proposed by the local – back down to employees, demanded huge concessions on pensions, and attempted to keep replacement workers on the job.

Dozens have pledged their solidarity with IAM Local 79 members by sending a message to Belshaw and related companies to stop the unfair treatment of workers and negotiate a fair settlement. The world's largest global union federation IndustriALL has also joined the fight by creating a message of solidarity to the strikers.

Where does the time go to? We will also be providing candy for the kids along the parade route as we have for many years, along with refreshments for our marchers. In addition, the delegates approved a donation to be made for the Local Lodge 1030/Peerless Chain joint picnic for kids prizes.
