The states of the IAM Midwest Territory sent representatives to St. Louis for the Midwest States Conference of Machinists to gather for a national political report from the IAM and to strategize for the upcoming election.

IAM delegates were joined by Illinois AFL-CIO President Tim Drea, U.S. Senate candidate Lucas Kunce (D-Mo.), Missouri House Rep. and gubernatorial candidate Crystal Quade (D), and Missouri AFL-CIO President Jake Hummel. Although unable to attend in person, U.S. Rep. Nikki Budzinski (D-Ill.) delivered a message to the congregation via video message.



Midwest Territory Chief of Staff Rick Mickschl gave a report showing the glaring differences between the Biden and Trump administrations, and stressed the importance of voting for the candidate who will support workers and families. He stressed the importance of educating our members of what has been accomplished with the most pro-union US President ever. We have a lot more to get done and need to ensure that those who have fought for us, as workers, remain in office.

The Legislative and MNPL Conferences will take place in Washington DC, June $17\text{-}22^{\text{nd}}$. I will be attending both Conferences, and Leah will join me for the Legislative Conference. It will be a busy election season for many of us and I will be reaching out to each of the Local Lodges for assistance to get the information out to our members. The Grand Lodge Convention, (which is scheduled for September $1\text{-}7^{\text{th}}$) conclusion will signal the beginning of our efforts to get out and promote our candidates.

As a final note, the District Lodge will be moving to Main Street in La Crosse, in early July. We have not settled on a specific date, as of this time.
